In FY18, Feeding San Diego distributed nearly 26 million meals through a variety of hunger-relief initiatives:

FEEDING KIDS

Feeding San Diego distributes nutritious food to local students through directto-client distributions and community partner programs tailored to meet the needs of families with children.

FEEDING FAMILIES

Feeding San Diego works to provide healthy meals to families across the county through direct-to-client distributions and community partners.

FEEDING SENIORS

Seniors are California's fastest growing population. Feeding San Diego provides healthy meals to food-insecure seniors in San Diego County through direct-toclient and community partners.

FEEDING HEROES

San Diego is home to several military bases and thousands of active duty service members. Feeding San Diego proudly serves military families through direct-to-client distributions and community partners.

FEEDING EXCELLENCE

Feeding San Diego focuses on advocacy, CalFresh outreach and capacity building to maximize program impact.




SCHOOL PANTRY PROGRAM

The School Pantry Program is our largest childhood-hunger relief service and one of our most dignified ways to provide healthy, no-cost food to children and families in San Diego through twice-a-month farmer's market style distributions at Title 1 schools. When food is provided at convenient locations a family already visits, parents and guardians are able to save time and reduce transportation costs. Food distributed through the School Pantry Program is 75% fresh produce and 25% shelf-stable product.

BACKPACK PROGRAM

The BackPack Program provides local students with an easy-to-carry bag filled with healthy staple items and three to four pounds of fresh produce when leaving school on Thursday or Friday afternoon. This weekly program helps bridge the gap between weekday school meals, ensuring children are wellnourished and ready to learn on Monday. The content of the food distributed through the BackPack Program is 66% fresh produce and 34% shelf-stable product.

AFTER SCHOOL MEALS PROGRAM

The After School Meals Program helps meet children's needs after school by providing a supper or snack at convenient sites throughout San Diego. This program is primarily funded by the USDA through the California Department of Education.

SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM

REGIONAL SCHOOL BREAK PROGRAM

The Regional School Break Program includes farmer's market-style pantries in each region of the county during summer, spring, and winter school breaks.

FEEDING FAMILIES



MOBILE PANTRY PROGRAM

Feeding San Diego serves families in the rural north and east areas of San Diego through the Mobile Pantry Program, a unique traveling pantry operation. One of our trucks visits each site twice a month to deliver food to underserved populations, many of whom are low-income households, farmers, migrant workers, and seniors. The content of the food distributed through the Mobile Pantry Program is 70% fresh produce and 30% donated product.

AGENCY PARTNER PROGRAM

Feeding San Diego partners with local nonprofit organizations who operate their own food pantries and food distribution programs in neighborhoods throughout the county, including Interfaith Community Services, Community Resource Center, Wesley Community Services Center, Us 4 Warriors Foundation, McAlister Institute and many other reputable organizations with expertise in addressing specific human needs. We provide deliveries of food, coordinate their pickup of rescued food from donors and retail partners, and ensure food safety and compliance standards are in place to protect people facing hunger. In addition, Feeding San Diego provides limited cash and in-kind grants to support partner agencies in strengthening and expanding their capacity to serve additional people in need.

COLLEGE PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM

Feeding San Diego serves post-secondary students and their families attending community college and continuing education courses through our College Partnerships Program. Campuses host farmer's market-style pantries on a monthly or weekly basis, primarily using rescued food from our generous food donors and retail partners. Food distributed through the College Partnerships Program is 72% fresh produce and 28% shelf-stable product.

FEEDING EXCELLENCE

HEALTHCARE PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM

The Healthcare Partnerships Program aims to help patients manage their health by improving food security through healthy food and nutrition education. Target population includes patients diagnosed with chronic illness, identified as food insecure and under medical treatment with partnering healthcare providers. The content of the food distributed is nutritious, shelf-stable foods that follow a cardiac diet, including 50% fresh fruits and vegetables. Nutrition resources and recipes are provided each month as well as nutrition-education classes and CalFresh application assistance when possible.

CALFRESH PROGRAM

The CalFresh Program works in collaboration with Feeding San Diego, its multiple distribution partners, the San Diego Hunger Coalition, and the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency's Hospital and Community Support Services unit. Collectively, we all work to inform the public and increase the number of San Diego households accessing CalFresh (SNAP) benefits.

FEEDING SENIORS

Feeding San Diego feeds seniors and older individuals through a combination of direct distributions, senior-housing complex services, community partnerships, and a meal-delivery partnership with Meals on Wheels East County. At our distributions, produce and healthy shelf-stable items are provided on a monthly basis. In addition, an estimated 10% of those we serve through our community partners are seniors living on fixed incomes. Food distributed through the Seniors Program is 72% fresh produce and 28% shelf-stable product, except for Meals on Wheels which is 100% produce.



FEEDING HEROES

Feeding San Diego is committed to increasing access to food for active-duty military and veteran households facing food insecurity. The Feeding Heroes Program offers distributions on or near base, in military housing areas, and in public schools serving a high percentage of military families. Through a dignified farmers' market-style distribution where individuals select the foods that are best for their needs, military families can access fresh, nutritious food, especially fruits and vegetables.




